OAKLAND, June 1, 2014 — THE MILLS COLLEGE ART MUSEUM (MCAM) is pleased to announce *Cross Section: Recent Acquisitions*, an exhibition showcasing recently acquired pieces in dialogue with artwork from MCAM's permanent collection. The exhibition celebrates the diversity of the Museum's holdings, featuring a range of media from painting, video, and photography to sculpture and works on paper and contextualizes new acquisitions of work by Binh Danh, Judy Chicago, Joanne Leonard, Mika Rottenberg, Sylvia Sleigh, Allison Smith, Kathryn Spence, Carrie Mae Weems, and Pae White, among others, with the works in the collection by artists such as Ansel Adams, Joseph Breitenbach, Sam Easterson, Olafur Eliasson, and Mona Hatoum.
