## The 96<sup>th</sup> Ritual (for Anna Halprin)

Mills College Art Museum September 14–December 11, 2016

**Oakland, CA—June 15, 2016** The Mills College Art Museum (MCAM) is pleased to announce on view from September 14 to December 11, 2016. Featuring photography, video, scores, and installation *The 96<sup>th</sup> Ritual (for Anna Halprin)* documents the performance project *95 Rituals*, directed by Shinichi Iova-Koga, performed by dance company inkBoat, and presented by Dancers' Group in 2015. Dedicated to

modern dance pioneer Anna Halprin's 95<sup>th</sup> birthday, 95 Rituals culminated in performances at the Hyde Street Pier in San Francisco.

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Anna Halprin is a visionary Bay Area artist whose work has radically expanded the purpose, process, and content of dance-making over seven decades. To inform their process, lova-Koga and inkBoat researched Halprin's intentions and working methods, which emphasize [key elements/concepts of Halprin's practice].

The original 95 Rituals was structured around 95 different scores developed from contributions by a wide range of visual and performing artists. Each contributing artist was given a template based the RSVP cycle—a system of art creation developed by Halprin and her late husband, Lawrence, in which collaborators gather resource material, develop a score or set of instructions, evaluate the work and perform. 95 Rituals culminated in explicitly experimental performances at the Hyde Street Pier, with the audience witnessed a series of still-forming ideas that dissolve the hard line between performance and process.

**inkBoat** is a physical theatre and dance company founded by <u>Shinichi Iova-Koga</u> in 1998. The company performs in theaters and <u>site specific locations</u>. Repertory and research integrate the interplay of <u>multiple artistic disciplines</u> and viewpoints, both experimental and traditional, resulting in <u>original performance compositions</u>. Themes and subjects arise from meticulous examination of everyday life, with primary content arising from the body, resulting in both refined and raw expressions.

Inkboat derives inspiration from working in wild, natural settings and urban existence.

Shinichi Iova-Koga has co-directed works with Anna Halprin, Ko Murobushi, Sten Rudstrøm, Yuko Kaseki, Takuya Ishide and KT Nelson (ODC) and has co-created performances with music groups Rova Saxophone Quartet and Sleepytime Gorilla Museum.

Shinichi continues his training and development incorporating techniques and art forms such as modern dance, action theater, Shakuhachi, Aikido, Nihon Buyo, Kagura and Noh Theater, Tadashi Suzuki Training, Hiroko Tamano, Butoh Dance, and Judo.

Shinichi was named one of the "25 to watch" in 2008 by Dance Magazine and awarded a "<u>Goldie</u>" award by the SF Bay Guardian in 2007. inkBoat has been recognized numerous times by the Isadora Duncan Awards Committee, receiving 12 nominations and 4 Izzie awards.

Shinichi has been teaching dance composition at Mills College since 2009.
